CHURCH CORE VALUES

CHURCH HISTORY

The Church's History

Deal Pentecostal Church started in 1927 when the Evangelist Stephen Jeffreys held a Healing Crusade at the **Winter Gardens Theatre** (now Astor Theatre) in Stanhope Road.

The East Kent Mercury report stated: “*Evidently the Pastor believes in the maxim that the devil is mad when God's people are glad. His sermons are decidedly good.*”

At the end of that crusade an **Assemblies of God Pentecostal Church** was formed and met in Nelson Road, eventually buying a building in Western Road. In 1989 the Church bought their present property in Mill Hill.

The building was originally “*Glynn Vivian Miners Mission*” which was established in 1927 to support the newly opened coal mines at Betteshanger and surrounding area (we still have some “*Glynn Vivian*” crockery). In 2006 the church changed its name from *New Life Christian Centre* to *Deal Pentecostal Church*.

The Pastors' History

Margaret and Paul Fermor came to Deal in 1999. Paul began his training for the ministry in 1989 at the Plymouth Elim Pentecostal Church in Devon. After a year of academic study, Paul, together with Margaret, pastored a church in Stowmarket, Suffolk before moving to Bridgwater, Somerset in 1993 to pioneer a church there. After completing further studies, Paul was ordained in 1994 as a Minister with the Elim Pentecostal Churches. During their time in Bridgwater, Margaret and Paul hosted “*Discipleship Schools*” where people from the UK and overseas came for intense training before being encouraged to “*go and make disciples of all nations*”. Many of those students are still ministering effectively in various parts of the world today. Paul has ministered in many countries including USA, Zimbabwe, Zambia, Philippines and Latvia. Both Margaret and Paul have been privileged to see God perform miracles through their ministry, however their emphasis is Emmanuel—God is with us. In 2004, Paul graduated with a Master’s degree in Theology from the University of Wales, Bangor, through the AoG Bible College at Mattersey, Notts. His subjects were *Church History* and *Divine Healing* with a dissertation on “*The effect of miracles on faith throughout Church history*”.

Paul was Treasurer of the South East Region of Assemblies of God from 2002-2011 and their Chairman from 2008-2011. He is currently the Clerk of Appeals with Assemblies of God (GB) and a member of their Professional Standards Team. Locally, Paul is Senior Chaplain with the South East Coast Ambulance Trust, with oversight of the Trust’s Chaplains throughout Kent, Sussex and Surrey.

CHURCH VISION

Our Church's Vision is JESUS and we believe that He should be our focus.

We proclaim Jesus, admonishing and teaching everyone with all wisdom so that we may present everyone perfect in Christ ^{Col.1:28}

We want to give every man, woman and child the opportunity of understanding the Gospel and provide a Church where they can grow and develop in ministry for the glory of God

To fulfil this vision we are:

A Local Church with a World Vision:

We meet locally for worship, prayer, Bible teaching and fellowship. We minister globally, reaching out to the world with the good news of Jesus Christ.

A Praying and Glorious Church:

God intends that His wisdom is seen and His glory experienced in the Church. As we pray fervently and in faith, we see God perform miracles.

A Training Church:

Our Church Services are planned to equip the congregation to live faith-full lives and to prepare them for works of service. We encourage active participation in the corporate Praise, Worship, Prayer, Bible Reading and Ministry. Church is a life-boat not a pleasure-boat and we are called to be workers not spectators. We want all of God's people to be released to minister the Gospel.

A Sending Church:

Our Church is a Mission Church and we send our members out as missionaries. A Missionary is not someone across the sea but someone who sees a cross! The mission field begins in our neighbourhood and extends to the nations.

CHURCH VALUES

Preaching and Teaching the Bible:

The Bible is the basis of everything we believe and testifies of Jesus, who is the Word of God. God's Word is spirit and life. It is active and works in us who believe because faith comes from hearing the Word of God proclaimed.

Prevailing Faith:

Prevail means "to win through, to take the crown, to overcome". Faith is the complete confidence in God and His Word. It is prevailing faith that overcomes and keeps us in victory. Maturity comes from the testing of our faith. We are blessed if we persevere and don't give up.

Presence of God:

God can be known personally and to know Him is eternal life. God lives in us by the Holy Spirit and in His Presence, miracles become normal, prayers are answered and love for Jesus deepens.

Passionate Love for God:

Our love for God will be extreme if we have been forgiven much. God wants us to be totally absorbed with Him and His will.

Praise, Worship and Glory:

Our objective in Praise and Worship is to express our love for Jesus, so our songs are based on Scripture and very Jesus centred. As we spend time appreciating God, it is easy to hear Him speak to us. We determine to know God's "glory" or "overwhelming Presence".

Prayer:

The fervent prayer of a Believer is powerful and effective. We pray in confidence, with boldness and in faith, knowing that we can receive anything from God if we ask according to His will.

Pentecostal Power - Holy Spirit Baptism:

God wants us to be continually overflowing with the Holy Spirit who empowers Believers to live a victorious, overcoming and faith-full Christian life.

Pledge of a Good Conscience - Water Baptism:

God has saved us to live in His blessings of health, wealth and wisdom. Water baptism of Believers is a pledge of a good conscience and an important part of our salvation experience.

Proportional Giving:

Tithing is the normal minimum giving for Christians and is much more than just the physical act of giving to the church. Tithing is giving cheerfully a part of our income into the storehouse (that is, the place that spiritually feeds us). Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house.^{Mal.3:10} Although a tithe is usually considered 10%, the Bible says that we should not be pressured by others: Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.^{2Cor.9:7}

Prophetic Ministry Gifts:

God has given to the Church the specific Ministry gifts of Apostles, Prophets, Evangelists, Pastors & Teachers, to train, equip, edify, unite and mature us. Ministers who have these gifts are regularly invited to speak at our Church in order to complement the Ministry gifts of our Pastor and Church leadership. God has also given to the Church, other gifts to help us such as, miracles, healings, helps, administration and variety of tongues. We expect these gifts to be in operation in our Church.

Pastoral Care:

The Church leaders are committed to serving you and make themselves freely available. In the same way, the Church leaders ask that you commit yourself to them. However, we do not have dominion over another person's faith.^{2Cor.1:24}

This means that the Church leaders' authority is limited to the Church activities—you are accountable to God for your own actions and on day will have to answer to Him. Church leaders are appointed to equip and release you to serve God, not control you. Our desire is for every Church member to grow into maturity and to be able to minister the Gospel effectively. We want our "ordinary" members to be, and to do, something "extra-ordinary" for God.

We are guides into God's most sublime secrets, not security guards posted to protect them.^{1Cor.4:1 TM}

CHURCH MEETINGS

The Greek word for **Church** in the NT is *Eklesia* meaning “**a gathering of citizens called out from their homes into some public place for the purpose of deliberating**” (deliberating = discourse or debate with action taken after careful consideration).

♦ **Gathering:** Church is always a *gathering* of people never just 1 or 2 people in their home.

Citizens: Christians are *citizens* of heaven. This has nothing to do with our natural or first birth but solely to do with our second birth from above: *Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and aliens, but fellow citizens with God’s people and members of God’s household.*^{Eph.2:19} *But our citizenship is in heaven.*^{Phil.3:20}

Called: We have responded to God’s *call* and are doing something about it. Church is when we leave our home thinking - lunch, business, family, friends, leisure etc. to worship God with a single mind: *His divine power has given us everything we need for life and godliness through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness.*^{2Pet.1:3}

♦ **Public:** Church meets in *public* not in private. We are not a secret society or cult. We are transparent and accountable.

Now this is our boast: Our conscience testifies that we have conducted ourselves in the world, and especially in our relations with you, in the holiness and sincerity that are from God. We have done so not according to worldly wisdom but according to God’s grace. For we do not write you anything you cannot read or understand.^{2Cor.1:12-13} *Unlike so many, we do not peddle the word of God for profit. On the contrary, in Christ we speak before God with sincerity, like men sent from God.*^{2Cor.2:17}

Purpose: Our meetings are *deliberate* and we intend to take action after hearing the facts. *They received the message with great eagerness and examined the Scriptures every day to see if what Paul said was true.*^{Acts.17:11}

We are **Church** when we come together in public to make quality decisions to change after spending time together listening to God's Word. Church is always an activity with purpose. We don't come together casually but determine to give our best to God because He deserves it. Worship means worth-ship; what God is worth to me.

Jesus is building His Church on the foundation of sound doctrine and teaching. Sound teaching is balanced truth (or truth that is explored fully) not truth that is compromised or restricted.

"You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." ...on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it (or not prove stronger than it). ^{Matt.16:16-18}

Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and aliens, but fellow citizens with God's people and members of God's household, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone. ^{Eph.2:19-20}

Watch your life and doctrine closely. Persevere in them, because if you do, you will save both yourself and your hearers. ^{1Tim.4:16}

Church Activities

We make every effort not to burden members with excessive numbers of regular meetings but the meetings we do have are important. Our regular meetings at present are Sunday mornings, and Wednesday mornings. Church members are expected to attend these meetings whenever possible. Church is inclusive never exclusive. Groups separated by natural parameters such as age, culture, language etc. are departments of the Church. The only boundary God has put on the Church is the spiritual parameter of the **new-birth**. Jesus declared, "I tell you the truth, no-one can see the kingdom of God unless he is born again." ^{Jn.3:3} Although everyone who is born-again is a member of God's Church, those who believe that God has called them to our local Church and want to commit themselves to our Church family are welcome to become Members of Deal Pentecostal Church.

Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe stands condemned already because he has not believed in the name of God's one and only Son.^{Jn.3:18}

Whoever believes and is baptised will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned.^{Mk.16:16}

In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace.^{Eph.1:7}

to the church of the firstborn, whose names are written in heaven.^{Heb.12:23}

The acts of the sinful nature are obvious: sexual immorality, impurity and debauchery; idolatry and witchcraft; hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, dissensions, factions and envy; drunkenness, orgies, and the like. I warn you, as I did before, that those who live like this will not inherit the kingdom of God.^{Gal.5:19-21}

When you were dead in your sins and in ...your sinful nature, God made you alive with Christ. He forgave us all our sins, having cancelled the written code, with its regulations, that was against us and that stood opposed to us; he took it away, nailing it to the cross.^{Col.2:13-14}

Pastoral Care and Ministry

Pastoral care by the leadership is mostly achieved through the fellowship times that we have around the refreshments and meals. Occasionally home visits are required when sickness or emergencies arise. The Church leaders are encouraged to take an active interest in all Church activities as part of the pastoral care provided by the Church. **We encourage and expect the fellowship of Believers.** Our fellowship should remind, reflect, repeat, rehearse and reinforce the truths that we are learning together as a Church.

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer.^{Acts.2:42}

Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care, serving as overseers—not because you must, but because you are willing, as God wants you to be; not greedy for money, but eager to serve;^{1Pet.5:2}

The ministry in our Church is overseen by the Church leadership. We emphasize, expect and experience the Ministry of the Holy Spirit and have total confidence in God's ability to save and to heal. When God is ministering to people, we endeavour to ensure their safety and comfort.

The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word.^{Heb.1:3}

Therefore he is able to save completely those who come to God through him, because he always lives to intercede for them.^{Heb.7:25}

He sent forth his word and healed them;^{Ps.107:20}

being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus.^{Phil.1:6}

Ministry in our Church is conducted in public where any prophecy can be judged. On the few exceptions where ministry is in private, all precautions are taken to prevent any appearance of inappropriateness. **We strongly discourage personal ministry where there are no witnesses present.** This type of ministry can easily lead to abuse and an unhealthy dependence on a person rather than God

Two or three prophets should speak, and the others should weigh carefully what is said. [Let the prophets speak two or three, and let the other judge.]^{AV}^{1Cor.14:29}

Every matter must be established by the testimony of two or three witnesses.^{2Cor.13:1}

But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin.^{1Jn.1:7}

Now the overseer must be above reproach.^{1Tim.3:2}

CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

Membership of our Church is open to all Christians (over 16 years old) who desire to worship within the context of our Fundamental Truths and who actively support our Vision & Values. Before being accepted as a Church Member, each candidate should have been Water-Baptised as a Believer, be attending our Church Services regularly and be seen to be integrating into the Church family and activities before they are accepted as Members. All Members are expected to be Holy Spirit Baptised (or to be seeking such) and be living a life that is honouring to God. Upon being accepted as a Member of this local Church, candidates will be asked to publicly commit themselves to our Church Family. They will then be publicly welcomed as Church Members. A Church Member must have been attending our Church for at least 6 months before they will be given any leadership responsibility.

Church is our extended family.

Being single is good. We are born single and die single. Being alone is not good (whether we marry or not). God has set the lonely in families

The LORD God said, "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him."^{Gen.2:18}

God sets the lonely in families, he leads forth the prisoners with singing; but the rebellious live in a sun-scorched land.^{Ps.68:6}

We expect the Holy Spirit Giftings to lead us through His gifts manifested in the Believers within the Church.

Our Church is led by the Church leaders not by the Congregation, however, any major decisions will be brought to the Church members for ratification before being implemented. The Pastor is responsible for the conduct of the Services but is answerable to the other Church leaders. The Pastor is credentialed by AoG and is accountable to them for conduct and doctrine.

It was he who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers,^{Eph.4:11}

Now about spiritual gifts, brothers, I do not want you to be ignorant.^{1Cor.12:1}

Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good.^{1Cor.12:7}

And in the church God has appointed first of all apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then workers of miracles, also those having gifts of healing, those able to help others, those with gifts of administration, and those speaking in different kinds of tongues.^{1Cor.12:28}

We believe in an “open” Church

The Holy Spirit empowers and equips people for ministry. **Any Believer, whether a member or not, may actively participate in our services** and if so led, bring a prophecy, a word of encouragement or an exhortation. The Church leaders are committed to facilitating the ministry gifts of the Holy Spirit but also take seriously the responsibility to weigh carefully what is said.

Two or three prophets should speak, and the others should weigh carefully what is said.^{1Cor.14:29}

The Church leaders’ authority is limited to Church activities and instruction in the Word of God. Outside the Church meetings they have no jurisdiction or authority over others unless requested.

To the elders among you, I appeal as a fellow-elder, a witness of Christ's sufferings and one who also will share in the glory to be revealed: Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care, serving as overseers—not because you must, but because you are willing, as God wants you to be; not greedy for money, but eager to serve; not lording it over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock. And when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory that will never fade away.^{1Pet.5:1-4}

Obey your leaders and submit to their authority. They keep watch over you as men who must give an account. Obey them so that their work will be a joy, not a burden, for that would be of no advantage to you.^{Heb.13:17}

Not that we lord it over your faith, but we work with you for your joy, because it is by faith you stand firm.^{2Cor.1:24}

All this I saw, as I applied my mind to everything done under the sun. There is a time when a man lords it over others to his own hurt.^{Ecc.8:9}

We expect our members to behave at all times in a manner that honours Jesus and is compatible with the Vision and Values of our Church.

We have observed that people who oppose the Church leadership for no scriptural reason, do not stay in fellowship with us, and, unless they repent, they do not stay in fellowship with God either!

When a Christians from another Church wishes to join our Church, it is normal for us to contact the Pastor of their previous Church. If a member decides to leave us, we encourage them to allow us to pray for them and to send them to their new Church family with our blessing. We believe in being accountable and transparent. Membership of our Church is dependent upon a person's support of our Vision & Values and their desire to worship God with us. It is not necessarily a lifetime commitment.

David went out to meet them and said to them: If you have come to me in peace, to help me, I am ready to have you unite with me. But if you have come to betray me to my enemies when my hands are free from violence, may the God of our fathers see it and judge you.^{1Chron.12:17}

Church membership does not mean that we have had an impeccable past but it does show that we have had miraculous conversion—and that guarantees a glorious future!

All those who were in distress or in debt or discontented gathered round him, and he became their leader. About four hundred men were with him.^{1Sam.22:2}

For you have been born again, not of perishable seed, but of imperishable, through the living and enduring word of God.^{1Pet.1:23}

And you also were included in Christ when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation. Having believed, you were marked in him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit, who is a deposit guaranteeing our inheritance until the redemption of those who are God's possession—to the praise of his glory.^{Eph.1:13-14}

One of the names of Jesus is **Emmanuel**—which means “*God is with us*”. We recognise that God is now with us and that He will never leave us.

Jesus replied, "If anyone loves me, he will obey my teaching. My Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him."^{Jn.14:23}

God has said, "Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you."^{Heb.13:5}

Examine yourselves to see whether you are in the faith; test yourselves. Do you not realise that Christ Jesus is in you—unless, of course, you fail the test? And I trust that you will discover that we have not failed the test.^{2Cor.13:5-6}

Biblical Personal Values

We don't impose personal values that are not clearly taught in the New Testament, but we do insist on those values that are plainly taught. For example, while drunkenness is clearly not acceptable, the total abstinence from alcohol cannot be sustained from NT teaching. Divorce in certain circumstances may be permitted, but we reject outright, all immoral relationships, including adultery, homosexuality, pornography and abuse.

Please note: we uphold the Biblical standard of monogamous, heterosexual marriage between a biological man and biological woman as the only acceptable union.

Do you not know that the wicked will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived: Neither the sexually immoral nor idolaters nor adulterers nor male prostitutes nor homosexual offenders nor thieves nor the greedy nor drunkards nor slanderers nor swindlers will inherit the kingdom of God. And that is what some of you were. But you were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God.^{1Cor.6:9-11}

MEMBERSHIP BENEFITS

We know we are loved and cared for

We are important to someone – important enough for them to help us, regardless of the cost.

Greater love has no-one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends. You are my friends if you do what I command. I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you.^{Jn.15:13-15}

We know we belong

We have a sense of security and support, knowing that someone is concerned for us.

Because there is one loaf, we, who are many, are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf.^{1Cor.10:17}

Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn. Live in harmony with one another. Do not be proud, but be willing to associate with people of low position. Do not be conceited.^{Rom.12:15-16}

I have no-one else like him, who takes a genuine interest in your welfare. For everyone looks out for his own interests, not those of Jesus Christ.^{Phil.2:20-21}

We know we have help available to us

We are not afraid to ask for assistance. We can receive help and also give help. We also have someone who will tell us when we are wrong

All the believers were one in heart and mind. No-one claimed that any of his possessions was his own, but they shared everything they had. With great power the apostles continued to testify to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and much grace was upon them all. There were no needy persons among them. For from time to time those who owned lands or houses sold them, brought the money from the sales and put it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to anyone as he had need.^{Acts.4:32-35}

My brothers, if one of you should wander from the truth and someone should bring him back, remember this: Whoever turns a sinner from the error of his way will save him from death and cover over a multitude of sins.^{Jas.5:19-20}

MEMBERSHIP RESPONSIBILITIES

Church should be enjoyable but with Church membership come responsibilities. We expect all Members to participate willingly in our church's activities. **“No” is not an acceptable answer!**

The Church is a Lifeboat, not a Pleasure boat; there is no room for spectators - we are all called to serve. **We are in the business of changing “members” into “missionaries”!**

You, my brothers, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the sinful nature; rather, serve one another in love. ^{Gal.5:13}

Members matter!

Each member is expected to function as a Believer both spiritually and practically, within the Church and outside of the Church. Although we are servants, we are not slaves and each of us has a choice—we have chosen to serve God out of gratitude not under compulsion. We love God because He first loved us!

What then shall we say, brothers? When you come together, everyone has a hymn, or a word of instruction, a revelation, a tongue or an interpretation. All of these must be done for the strengthening of the church. ^{1Cor.14:26}

The King will reply, 'I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me.' ^{1Matt.25:40}

He will reply, 'I tell you the truth, whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me.' ^{1Matt.25:45}

If anyone says, "I love God," yet hates his brother, he is a liar. For anyone who does not love his brother, whom he has seen, cannot love God, whom he has not seen. And he has given us this command: Whoever loves God must also love his brother. ^{1Jn.4:20-21}

Cultivate your own relationship with God but don't impose it on others...

If the way you live isn't consistent with what you believe, then it is wrong
Rom.14:23 TM

We are members of Jesus Body

God has made us one with Him and with each other. It is a serious matter to divide what God has joined together. Malevolent gossip, backbiting, bitterness and resentment will divide the Body—we don't do it!

For we are members of his body. "For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh." This is a profound mystery—but I am talking about Christ and the church.^{Eph.5:30-32}

'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh'? So they are no longer two, but one. Therefore what God has joined together, let man not separate.^{Matt.19:5-6}
But he who unites himself with the Lord is one with him in spirit.^{1Cor.6:17}

We are all responsible for maintaining unity

God has already united us—now it's up to us to keep that unity. *Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to one hope when you were called— one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.*^{Eph.4:2-6}

What if a Christian sins?

The Church should treat people in exactly the same that God treats them. If a sin is confessed and repented of, God has no record of it—so why should the Church hold their past against someone? However, in order to facilitate restoration, it may be prudent to relieve people of their responsibilities for a period of time sometimes. It is important that someone is not placed in situations where it would be easy to repeat previous transgressions. For recurring problems, repentance should be proved by a person's actions before they are given responsibilities again. However, if a criminal offence has been committed, we have a moral and legal obligation to inform the Police.

Our Church has a **Safeguarding Policy** which requires us to involve the relevant authorities should any child or vulnerable adult be perceived to be in danger.

If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.^{1Jn.1:9}

Produce fruit in keeping with repentance.^{Matt.3:8}

What if a member does not repent or want to change?

In extreme cases, it is within the Church's jurisdiction to suspend or expel a person from membership. When relationships breakdown, our intention is to bring reconciliation with God and with people so we always try to keep the door of communication open. But until the person wants to be reconciled to God they will never be truly reconciled to people.

But now I am writing to you that you must not associate with anyone who calls himself a brother but is sexually immoral or greedy, an idolater or a slanderer, a drunkard or a swindler. With such a man do not even eat.^{Cor.5:11}

Now instead, you ought to forgive and comfort him, so that he will not be overwhelmed by excessive sorrow. I urge you, therefore, to reaffirm your love for him.^{2Cor.2:7-8}

LEADERSHIP AND LEADERSHIP ISSUES

Management Trustees

The Church Council are the Management Trustees. They comprise of the Minister, together with other Church members appointed by the Church Council and must satisfy the requirements of Scripture as found in *1Timothy 3:8-13*. All Trustee appointments should be ratified by Church members at the AGM or at an extra-ordinary Church meeting. The current **Management Trustees** are **Paul Fermor, Margaret Fermor, Ray Teague, Jean Odon, Mark Toogood, Geraldine Farrugia, Joy Crick.**

The Church Council is legally responsible for the management of the Church and has the spiritual oversight of the Church. The minimum number of the Council is three with the quorum consisting of more than half the number of Church Council members. Normally the Senior Minister of the Church is the Chairman and the Church Council meet at least four times a year, regulating their own proceedings. Notice of at least forty-eight hours has to be given for Church Council meetings unless all agree to attend. Requests for specific matters to be considered may be submitted in writing to the Minister or Church Council at least one week before a meeting.

Holding Trustees

The Holding Trustees are the named people on the Deeds of the Church's property lodged with the Land Registry. We have used the Charity Commission's Officiation Custodian as our Holding Trustees. The application by Officiation Custodian was accepted 23/03/2020

Leaders of Departments

All those in any form of leadership must be a Church Member and have been attending our Church regularly for at least 6 months. They are expected to set an example by attending the main Church meetings prepared and in time to be used as required. Prior notification should be given to the Leadership of any expected non-attendance.

Complaints

The Church has a *Complaints and Grievance Policy* which is available from our Church website or the Church Office. A member with a grievance, other than one relating to a disciplinary matter, may ask the Minister or Church Council to investigate the matter. The Church Leadership would take any substantiated complaint seriously but where there is a conflict between personalities, we expect the individuals to try to address the matter with each other before approaching the

Church. The biblical principle for resolving difficulties is for the offended party to go and see the other person to seek reconciliation as described in *Matthew 5:23-24 and 18:15-17*.

If members have a misunderstanding, disagreement or grievance within the Church, but find it difficult to approach the Pastor, they should contact another member of the Church Leadership, another Minister who regularly ministers at the Church, or contact AOG Area Council. This safety-net is here so that no-one needs to feel they are beyond help or that they are being disloyal.

Autonomy of the Church

The Church is free to conduct all its own congregational affairs without the infringing of its rightful privileges by the AoG General Council, its Committees, Departments or Members or by any AoG Area Council except in matters specified by the AoG Constitution.

AoG Assistance

In the event of serious difficulties arising within the Church, application for advice or assistance may be made to the AoG Area Council. This assistance would be given when the Pastor, the Church Council or $\frac{1}{3}$ of the Church Members request it. The AoG Appeals Panel may be appealed to if either party is not satisfied with the ruling of the Area Council.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Why are we a Pentecostal Church?

As a Pentecostal Church we expect the experiences recorded in Acts to be evident in the Church today. The Holy Spirit who empowers Believers today is the same Holy Spirit who empowered the Apostles in the Bible times. We call this empowerment the “**baptism of the Holy Spirit**” which is distinct from the new birth. **At conversion the Holy Spirit**

comes into a person. At Spirit baptism the Holy Spirit flows out of a person!

“Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, streams of living water will flow from within him.” By this he meant the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were later to receive. Up to that time the Spirit had not been given, since Jesus had not yet been glorified. ^{Jn.7:38-39}

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth. ^{Acts.1:8}

Repent and be baptised, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off—for all whom the Lord our God will call. ^{Acts.2:38-39}

When they arrived, they prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit, because the Holy Spirit had not yet come upon any of them; they had simply been baptised into the name of the Lord Jesus. Then Peter and John placed their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit. ^{Acts.8:15-17}

When Paul placed his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came on them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied. ^{Acts.19:6}

Why do we read the Bible together in our Services?

The Bible tells us to! Reading the Bible together focuses our thoughts and unites everyone around God. Faith comes from hearing the word of God and it is good to facilitate faith at the beginning of a Service.

Until I come, devote yourself to the public reading of Scripture, to preaching and to teaching. ^{1Tim.4:13}

to make her holy, cleansing her by the washing with water through the word, ^{Eph.5:26}

Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word of Christ. ^{Rom.10:17}

The unfolding of your words gives light; it gives understanding to the simple. ^{P.s.119:130}

All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness,^{2Tim.3:16}

For the word of God is living and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart.^{Heb.4:12}

And the Father who sent me has himself testified concerning me. You have never heard his voice nor seen his form, nor does his word dwell in you, for you do not believe the one he sent. You diligently study the Scriptures because you think that by them you possess eternal life. These are the Scriptures that testify about me, yet you refuse to come to me to have life.^{Jn.5:37-40}

We are a New Covenant Church

We need to rightly divide the Word of God^{2Tim.2:15} and read it in the light of the New Covenant. For instance, it is pointless for us to pray for God to “rend the heavens and come down”^{Is.64:1} when He did that at Pentecost! **The Holy Spirit is here on earth right now** – Jesus does not send Him from heaven each day!

"The time is coming, declares the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel... this is the covenant I will make with the house of Israel after that time, declares the Lord. I will put my laws in their minds and write them on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people." By calling this covenant "new", he has made the first one obsolete; and what is obsolete and ageing will soon disappear.^{Heb.8:8-13}

I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high.^{Lk.24:49}

But I tell you the truth: It is for your good that I am going away. Unless I go away, the Counsellor will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you. When he comes, he will convict the world of guilt in regard to sin and righteousness and judgment.^{Jn.16:7-8}

No, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel: " 'In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams.^{Acts.2:16-17}

Why do we pray together in our Services?

Church Services are a corporate act of Worship and we should be partakers not spectators. Praying together is one way for everyone to participate. The Bible also gives us examples of Christians praying together.

When they heard this, they raised their voices together in prayer to God. "Sovereign Lord," they said, "you made the heaven and the earth and the sea, and everything in them."^{Acts.4:24}

I want men everywhere to lift up holy hands in prayer, without anger or disputing.^{1Tim.2:8}

Why do we pray for people to be healed in our Services?

We pray because God still heals people. Jesus instructed His Disciples to heal the sick. It is God's intention to display His glory and wisdom in the Church.

You are the God who performs miracles; you display your power among the peoples.^{Ps.77:14}

For I am the LORD, who heals you.^{Ex.15:26}

[Believers] will place their hands on sick people, and they will get well.^{Mk.16:18}
the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise him up.^{Jas.5:15}

His intent was that now, through the church, the manifold wisdom of God should be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly realms,^{Eph.3:10}

Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us,^{Eph.3:20}

Why do we give money in our Services?

We give as an act of worship and in appreciation of God's love and provision. To help us trust Him, God asks us to tithe. Tithing is giving cheerfully and in faith (*i.e. trusting God that the money will be used effectively and also that He will provide for our needs*) the 1st part of our income to God through the local Church. It is normally accepted that a Tithe is 10% of one's income. Because God has promised that seed-time and harvest

will never fail, we are confident that a good seed sown in good ground will eventually produce a good harvest. Before giving, we usually read some scripture verses together as an audible prayer to encourage us to trust God. We use a large offering receptacle to remind us that our God is a great God and that we can never out-give Him. By placing the receptacle at the front of the Church, we encourage people to take an active role in the offering rather than casually giving a “tip” when asked! We also use this time to remind each other that we are truly blessed by God.

And my God will meet all your needs according to his glorious riches in Christ Jesus.^{Phil.4:19}

On the first day of every week, each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with his income, saving it up, so that when I come no collections will have to be made.^{1Cor.16:2}

Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work. As it is written: "He has scattered abroad his gifts to the poor; his righteousness endures for ever." Now he who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will also supply and increase your store of seed and will enlarge the harvest of your righteousness. You will be made rich in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, and through us your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God.^{2Cor.9:6-11}

We believe that those who preach should receive payment from those instructed. This applies particularly to the Pastor but also to others who minister.

Anyone who receives instruction in the word must share all good things with his instructor. Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows. The one who sows to please his sinful nature, from that nature will reap destruction; the one who sows to please the Spirit, from the Spirit will reap eternal life. Let us not become weary in doing

good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up. Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers ^{Gal.6:6-10}

For it is written in the Law of Moses: "Do not muzzle an ox while it is treading out the grain." Is it about oxen that God is concerned? Surely he says this for us, doesn't he? Yes, this was written for us, because when the ploughman ploughs and the thresher threshes, they ought to do so in the hope of sharing in the harvest. If we have sown spiritual seed among you, is it too much if we reap a material harvest from you? If others have this right of support from you, shouldn't we have it all the more? But we did not use this right. On the contrary, we put up with anything rather than hinder the gospel of Christ. Don't you know that those who work in the temple get their food from the temple, and those who serve at the altar share in what is offered on the altar? In the same way, the Lord has commanded that those who preach the gospel should receive their living from the gospel. ^{1Cor.9:9-14}

Why do we sing hymns and songs in our Services?

Worship is our expression of the value or worth of God and singing is an easy way of doing this. Our songs are Jesus centred and our aim is to bring people into an awareness of God's majesty and glory together with an opportunity to express their own appreciation of Jesus. Thus our singing normally starts with "praise" – describing God's greatness and singing about Him (i.e. *Praise God from whom all blessings flow, Praise Him all creatures here below*). We will usually move on to "worship" – appreciating God and speaking directly to Him. (i.e. *Jesus, how lovely You are, You are so gentle so pure and so kind.*) Our objective is to bring people into a place where they are able to appreciate God without having to say or do anything – this is the "glory" realm and in this atmosphere, miracles become normal.

Speak to one another with psalms, hymns and spiritual songs. Sing and make music in your heart to the Lord, always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. ^{Eph.5:19-20}

When you come together, everyone has a hymn, or a word of instruction, a revelation, a tongue or an interpretation. All of these must be done for the strengthening of the church.^{1Cor.14:26}

Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshippers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for they are the kind of worshippers the Father seeks. God is spirit, and his worshippers must worship in spirit and in truth.^{Jn.4:23-24}

The Bible calls this place of Glory, the “Sabbath Rest”. It is a place of contentment and peace with an awareness of God’s protection and provision.

Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear.^{Matt.6:25}

Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you.^{1Pet.5:7}

Therefore, since the promise of entering his rest still stands, let us be careful that none of you be found to have fallen short of it... There remains, then, a Sabbath-rest for the people of God... Let us, therefore, make every effort to enter that rest, so that no-one will fall by following their example of disobedience.^{Heb.4:1-11}

Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light.^{Matt.11:29-30}

"Martha, Martha," the Lord answered, "you are worried and upset about many things, but only one thing is needed. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her."^{Lk.10:41-42}

A good definition of worship is found in Matthew’s Gospel:

After they had heard the king, they went on their way, and the star they had seen in the east went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshipped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold and of incense and of myrrh.^{Matt.2:9-11}

Note the sequence: **1) overjoyed; 2) they saw [Jesus]; 3) they bowed down and worshipped him; 4) they opened their treasures; 5) presented him with gifts.**

Why are the words we say, so important?

Our mouth is the door of our soul. It's not what we say we are; it is what we say, we are! Actually the tongue is the hardest of all creation to control.

From the fruit of his lips a man enjoys good things, but the unfaithful have a craving for violence.^{Prov.13:2}

The tongue has the power of life and death, and those who love it will eat its fruit.^{Prov.18:21}

Likewise the tongue is a small part of the body, but it makes great boasts. Consider what a great forest is set on fire by a small spark. The tongue also is a fire, a world of evil among the parts of the body. It corrupts the whole person, sets the whole course of his life on fire, and is itself set on fire by hell. All kinds of animals, birds, reptiles and creatures of the sea are being tamed and have been tamed by man, but no man can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison.^{Jas.3:5-8}

As we make a habit of agreeing with God's Word, we find that our thinking becomes God-like and our character becomes holy and wholesome. In the NT the Greek word for “confess” is ὁμολογέω (homologeô) and means “to speak the same word, to agree”. Thus when we “**confess Christ**” we mean that we are saying the same words as Jesus and agree with Him.

That if you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved.^{Rom.10:9-10}

Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will.^{Rom.12:2} .

Do not lie to each other, since you have taken off your old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge in the image of its Creator.^{Col.3:9-10}

You brood of vipers, how can you who are evil say anything good? For out of the overflow of the heart the mouth speaks. The good man brings good things out of the good stored up in him, and the evil man brings evil things out of the evil stored up in him. But I tell you that men will have to give account on the day of judgment for every careless word they have spoken. For by your words you will be acquitted, and by your words you will be condemned.^{Matt.12:34-37}

Mature Christians confess (talk about, speak, agree with) the Word of God.

The word “*infant*” in Heb.5:13 literally means a non-speaker. *We have much to say about this, but it is hard to explain because you are slow to learn. In fact, though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you the elementary truths of God's word all over again. You need milk, not solid food! Anyone who lives on milk, being still an infant, is not acquainted with the teaching about righteousness. But solid food is for the mature, who by constant use have trained themselves to distinguish good from evil.*^{Heb.5:11-14}

Do not let this Book of the Law depart from your mouth; meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful.^{Josh.1:8}

We must be careful what we say. God’s Word is true – even if everyone else disagrees

Diligent hands will rule, but laziness ends in slave labour.^{Prov.12:24}

Be diligent in these matters; give yourself wholly to them, so that everyone may see your progress. Watch your life and doctrine closely. Persevere in them, because if you do, you will save both yourself and your hearers.^{1Tim.4:15-16}

Not at all! Let God be true, and every man a liar. As it is written: "So that you may be proved right when you speak and prevail when you judge."^{Rom.3:4}

Anyone who believes in the Son of God has this testimony in his heart. Anyone who does not believe God has made him out to be a liar, because he has not believed the testimony God has given about his Son.^{1Jn.5:10}

God's Word is living and works in those who believe

For the word of God is living and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart. Nothing in all creation is hidden from God's sight. Everything is uncovered and laid bare before the eyes of him to whom we must give account.^{Heb.4:12-13}

And we also thank God continually because, when you received the word of God, which you heard from us, you accepted it not as the word of men, but as it actually is, the word of God, which is at work in you who believe.^{1Thes.2:13}

Deal Campaign.

South East Coast Presbytery Aggressive Programme.

After having organised two successful campaigns at Folkestone and Canterbury with Mr. Stephen Jeffreys as Revivalist, the Dover Assembly next turned their attention to the town of Deal.

The Winter Gardens Theatre was procured for the Pastor to hold a further mission. For three weeks prior to the opening date the young men and women Crusaders canvassed the town with handbills, also held open-air in various parts.

The campaign started on Thursday, May 19th, when pastors and people of the surrounding Assemblies nobly rallied for the fight. This gave a good testimony of a full Hall on the opening day. God's servant spoke with power, and as the days went by the tide of revival deepened. Altogether about 110 souls sought the pardon of their sins, the Lord also gave many Christians a new revelation of their inheritance in Christ. Many healings took place as the sick were ministered to in the Name of Jesus.

The Lord provided for the continuation of the work in a very wonderful way. A Baptist Chapel (now the Glad Tidings Hall) situated in Nelson Street, which had been used as an organ factory, has been procured on lease. The Pastor made known the need of furniture and funds were forthcoming to completely furnish the building. Since then loving hands have painted it throughout and built a platform. At an early date it is hoped that the Baptistry will be restored so that Believers can obey the truth of water Baptism.

Mr. G. A. Hibbert, of Grimsby, has taken over the Pastorate of this new Assembly of God. Please pray that the Lord may stand by our brother; he reports crowded meetings and continued blessing.

And the end is not yet, praise the Lord! Such successes from the Lord have made the saints at Dover bold to launch out further afield. The Corn Exchange, Maidstone, has been procured, and Mr. Stephen Jeffreys commences a campaign there on June 20th. A large hall has also been obtained at Tunbridge Wells for next January for the Pastor, and negotiations are now in hand for a further hall in Hastings. Why should not one Assembly open up several others?

The Kent Presbytery have stood by us in loving advice and help; and should the Lord tarry for a further little while, we as a Presbytery are determined to have Assemblies of God in all parts of the county. To our Gracious God and Him alone be all the glory. *A. Newington.*

Deal: Glad Tidings Hall.

15 Baptized: Cancer Healed.

Quite a transformation has taken place in what is now Glad Tidings Hall. Formerly the first Baptist Church in Deal, then an organ factory, it has now come into its first estate as a place where prayer is wont to be made, where a full and perfect salvation in Christ is preached, and baptism by immersion is practised.

The pastor (Mr. Hibbert), and his wife, are earnest and zealous, and there is a holy enthusiasm in the services, and quite a few have been won for Jesus. The attendances at the Assembly throughout the summer have been splendidly maintained, and the Friday evening Prayer Meeting has been the best attended Prayer Meeting in Deal - sometimes as many as 60 attending (a large number this little town), and a spirit of fervent believing prayer has ascended up to the throne of grace. Of course the enemy is at work, but, despite all, the work goes forward.

Many can truly testify to a great spiritual longing satisfied, and there been have times when the "*shout of a king has been among them*". My wife and myself can testify to a new spiritual impetus and joyousness in the Christian life through the meetings. On the last Sunday in July there was a Baptismal Service, when 15 were immersed, and we understand another baptismal service is being arranged for September 25th, when about 8 will obey the Lord's command.

Last month a brother was poked in the eye with a cow's horn, causing the eye to swell as if a large rubber ball had been inserted, and great discolouration, but bless God, after prayers had been made according to James v, 14, the eye was all right and quite normal in 4 days, swelling, pain, and everything disappearing. Another Sister, who was staying at Deal, had been given 2 months to live and was very ill suffering from cancer, has also been healed, and put on 7lbs in a few weeks; and on going back to her home the Doctor called her "*The Resurrection!*" *G.A.H.*

Deal: Old Renovated Baptist Church Opened

The spiritual side of the Assembly, too, is getting deeper. There is a revival spirit in the air, and souls are being saved. A Convention was held just before Christmas, and Mr. C. L. - 1. See the bigger picture of Scripture** i.e. know about the books of the Bible, where they are and what they are about, especially the NT. Remember the Bible is not a legal rule book but a love story about God and you and is written primarily for those who believe.^{1Jn.5:13}
- 2. See the purpose of Scripture - God's Plan of Redemption as revealed in Jesus - throughout the entire Bible.**^{Jn.5:13; 20:31}
- 3. Cultivate an awareness of God's Presence.** *They will call him Emmanuel which means 'God is with us.'*^{Matt.1:23} Affirm His love for you and your love for Him: *I am my beloved's and my beloved is mine;*^{S.ofS.6:3} remembering and reminding yourself of what God has said ^{2Pet.1:12-13; 3:1-2; Josh.1:8} knowing that all God's promises are yours in Jesus: *God has made a great many promises. They are all "Yes" because of what Christ has done. So through Christ we say "Amen." We want God to receive glory.*^{2Cor.1:20NIrV}
- 4. Consciously commit your ways to God throughout each day.** *Commit everything you do to the LORD. Trust him, and he will help you.*^{Ps.37:5NLT}
- 5. Consciously cast your cares onto God throughout each day:** *Give all your worries and cares to God, for he cares about you.*^{1Pet.5:7NLT}
- 6. 9. Grow in wisdom – like Jesus did: *Jesus became wiser and stronger. He also became more and more pleasing to God and to people.*^{Lk.2:5NIrV} **Wisdom is applied knowledge – putting**

God's word into practice: *Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man.*^{Matt.7:24}

Don't just listen to the word. You fool yourselves if you do that. You must do what it says. Suppose you listen to the word but don't do what it says. Then you are like a man who looks at his face in a mirror. After looking at himself, he leaves. Right away he forgets what he looks like. But suppose you take a good look at the perfect law that gives freedom. You keep looking at it. You don't forget what you've heard, but you do what the law says. Then you will be blessed in what you do. Suppose you think your beliefs are right because of how you live. But you don't control what you say. Then you are fooling yourselves. Your beliefs are not worth anything at all. Here are the kinds of beliefs that God our Father accepts as pure and without fault. When widows and children who have no parents are in trouble, take care of them. And keep yourselves from being polluted by the world.^{Jas.1:22-27NIrV}

You must have the same attitude that Christ Jesus had... Work hard to show the results of your salvation, obeying God with deep reverence and fear. For God is working in you, giving you the desire and the power to do what pleases him... And now, dear brothers and sisters, one final thing. Fix your thoughts on what is true, and honourable, and right, and pure, and lovely, and admirable. Think about things that are excellent and worthy of praise. Keep putting into practice all you learned and received from me—everything you heard from me and saw me doing. Then the God of peace will be with you^{Phil.2:5;12-13; 4:8-9 NLT}

STATEMENT OF FUNDAMENTAL TRUTHS

as approved by the General Council of Assemblies of God

This statement of Fundamental Truths is not intended as a creed for the Church but as a basis for unity for a full

Gospel Ministry: *I appeal to you, brothers, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree with one another so that there may be no divisions among you and that you may be perfectly united in mind and thought.*^{1Cor.1:10}

We believe that the Bible (i.e. the Old and New Testaments excluding the Apocrypha), is the inspired Word of God, the infallible, all sufficient rule for faith and practice (*2Tim.3:15-16; 2Pet.1:21*).

We believe in the unity of the One True and Living God who is the Eternal, Self-Existent "I AM", who has also revealed Himself as One Being co-existing in three Persons - Father, Son and Holy Spirit (*Deut.6:4; Mark12:29; Matt.28:19; 2Cor.13:14*).

We believe in the Virgin Birth, Sinless Life, Miraculous Ministry, Substitutionary Atoning Death, Bodily Resurrection, Triumphant Ascension and Abiding Intercession of the Lord Jesus Christ and in His personal, visible, bodily return in power and glory as the blessed hope of all believers. (*Isa.7:14; Matt.1:23; Heb.7:26; 1Pet.2:22; Acts 2:22; 10:38; 2Cor.5:21; Heb.9:12; Luke24:39; 1Cor.15:4; Acts1:9; Eph.4:8-10; Rom.8:34; Heb.7:25; 1Cor.15:22-24, 51-57; 1Thes.4:13-18; Rev.20:1-6*).

We believe in the fall of man, who was created pure and upright, but fell by voluntary transgression (*Gen.1:26-31; 3:1-7; Rom.5:12-21*).

We believe in salvation through faith in Christ, who, according to the Scriptures, died for our sins, was buried and was raised from the dead on the third day, and that through His Blood we have Redemption (*Titus 2:11; 3:5-7; Rom.10:8-15; 1Cor.15:3-4*). This experience is also known as the new birth, and is an instantaneous and complete operation of the Holy Spirit upon initial faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. (*John 3:5-6; James 1:18; 1Pet.1:23; 1John 5:1*).

We believe that all who have truly repented and believed in Christ as Lord and Saviour are commanded to be baptised by immersion in water (*Matt.28:19; Acts 10:47-48; Acts 2:38-9*).

We believe in the baptism in the Holy Spirit as an enduement of the believer with power for service, the essential biblical evidence of which is speaking with other tongues as the Spirit gives utterance (*Acts 1:4-5, 8; 2:4; 10:44-46; 11:14-16; 19:6*).

We believe in the operation of the gifts of the Holy Spirit and the gifts of Christ in the Church today (*1Cor.12:4-11, 28; Eph.4:7-16*).

We believe in holiness of life and conduct in obedience to the command of God (*1Pet.1:14-16; Heb.12:14; 1Thes.5:23; 1John 2:6*).

We believe that deliverance from sickness, by Divine Healing is provided for in the Atonement (*Isa.53:4-5; Matt.8:16-17; James 5:13-16*).

We believe that all who have truly repented and believe in Christ as Lord and Saviour should regularly participate in Breaking of Bread (*Luke 22:14-20; 1Cor.11:20-34*).

We believe in the bodily resurrection of all men, the everlasting conscious bliss of all who truly believe in our Lord Jesus Christ and the everlasting conscious punishment of all whose names are not written in the Book of Life (*Dan.12:2-3; John 5:28-29; 1Cor.15:22-24; Matt.25:46; 2Thes.1:9; Rev.20:10-15*).
